

# The Garden Gnome Layout

## Supplies Needed

Hello Spring Collection

*12 X 12 Sheets (One Sheet of Each)*

HS-104 Flutterby/Sunshine Dots

HS-109 Pretty in Plaid/Tulip Linen

HS-103 Spring Story/Poppy Linen

HS-106 Bloom & Grow/Sweet Pea Vine

HS-108 Teal Tweets/Green Grass Linen

Decorative Edged Cardstock

HS-133 6" x 6" Decorative Edge Double-sided Textured Cardstock - with glitter accents (5 pieces)

Fabric Embellishments

HS-220 Fabric Favorites - self adhesive

HS-223 Crochet Butterflies & Flowers

Stickers

HS-135 Cardstock Stickers - Favorite Pieces - with glitter and embossing

Chipboard Shapes

HS-279 Chipboard Shapes - with glitter accents

Additional Supplies

Border Punch, Scissors, Tape and Foam Adhesive, Paper Piercer, Letters for Title. NOTE- My picture sizes are a vertical 4x6 & a vertical 2.25 x 3.5 inches.

Cut 12 x 12 Sheets to the following sizes

HS-109 Pretty in Plaid/Tulip Linen 10 inches by 10 inches

HS-103 Spring Story/Poppy Linen 8.5 inches by 8.5 inches

HS-106 Bloom & Grow/Sweet Pea Vine 1.25 inches by 10.5 inches

(on this one, make sure you cut where the vine is going up and down vertically)

HS-108 Teal Tweets/Green Grass Linen 1.25 inches by 10.5 inches

To put layout together:

1. Border punch the top of the yellow sheet of paper. I used a binding edge border punch, but you could use any one that you have. Or you can leave it plain! Make it your layout.
2. Distress the edges of your plaid and orange paper. I just used my scissors and roughed them up.
3. Center and adhere the plaid paper in the center of your yellow paper.
4. Center your orange paper on top of the plaid, then move it down about 1 inch before you adhere it.
5. To make the grass, take each of your green strips and make .25 inch cuts vertically down them. Curl each strip of your front layer with a paper piercer (or anything that is very small in diameter). Layer them on top of each other and then attach them at the bottom of your layout, leaving some of the yellow showing.
6. Place your pink chipboard frame onto your Green Grass Linen paper and trace the outside. I did not trace the bows, just trimmed straight below where they would be. Cut out and then center your picture on to the Teal Tweets side of the paper. Then adhere your chipboard frame on top. This gives you a "mat" for the back of the frame on the sides.
7. Adhere your scallop circle about .25 inches from the top of the orange paper and leave it hanging over the left edge onto the plaid paper.
8. Adhere your pictures down, making sure to place the pink chipboard framed one on top of your green grass border strip. You may have to trim part of the curls to get it to lay flat.
9. Attach the tall chipboard flower to the side of the 4x6 picture, along with attaching the crochet butterfly in the corner. Using foam tape to pop up your chipboard cloud, adhere the cloud in the top right hand corner of the orange paper, leaving it hanging over the edge onto the plaid paper. You can also attach your fabric bunny on top of your grass in the left hand bottom corner.
10. Take the three flower from the sticker sheet and apply foam tape to the backs of them. Arrange in a row, tucking them behind your grass. I lowered the orange one slightly.
11. Add your title and enjoy your completed layout!
